Kindergarten Screening Assessment

- A. Sophie Rogers School for Early Learning + Center on Education and Training for Employment developed and piloted measure that is relatable for parents
- · Covers five domains:
 - · social and emotional development
 - · physical well-being and motor development
 - language and literacy development
 - · cognition and general knowledge (mathematics)
 - approaches toward learning

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SUPPORTING THE EARLY CHILDHOOD WORKFORCE CONTINUUM OF CARE & WORKFORCE SUPPORT



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Early Head Start Partnership Program expands services

- 5-year, \$23 million federal grant
- Adds 189 Head Start slots to the program, more than 70% increase in children served
- Expands continuum of care from prenatal to kindergarten entry

Early Childhood Education in Big Ten States


Big Ten Early Learning Alliance


- · Crane co-chairs newly formed alliance
